- 1. We are lucky to have a set of these in the woods. They used to be owned by St. Matthew's in the Woods and were maintained by members of the parish. After St. Matthews was combined with Saint Cyprian's to form All Saints Parish, this property was bought by a private citizen who still allows people to walk through.
- 2. When the kids want to play we know where to go! Volleyball, basketball, trails, and a baseball field make this spot a go-to for all things fun.
- 3. Baseball anyone? Soccer too? If you wanted to partake in those activities this stop is for you.
 4. Summit Township has one volunteer fire company, Perry Hi-Way Hose Company, founded in 1948 by a group of concerned residents. Among them was George Gauthier, who transformed a used vehicle into the first fire truck which served as a combination pumper and tanker. Over the years it continues to be a very dedicated group of concerned residents that keep Perry Hi-Way Hose Company running smoothly.
- Your first stop is to find the training grounds utilized by first responders throughout the area.
- Your second stop is to see where the social hall and sleeping quarters for the firefighters are located.
- 5. When St. Matthews in the Woods built the house for the priests, there were some tombs uncovered. Those were moved to this location and are still there for anyone to pay respects to.
- 6. Our township was founded in 1854, out of the western part of Greene, the eastern part of McKean, and a small section from the northern part of Waterford Township. Many believe the name was derived from early settlers who journeyed from the lakeshore of Erie upwards until reaching the dividing ridge running east to west (which separates the Lake Erie Watershed from the Ohio River Basin), to the top or the "Summit". The last stop of the scavenger hunt takes you to the place you can go for anything township related.
