

## Dear Summit Residents,

Our 2025 “Summit Simplicity” calendar includes photos with quotes to show that less is more and that simplicity has beauty.

As you know, Summit Township resumed mandatory curbside recycling in 2024. The new program allows each residential household to have their recycling collected curbside by their current trash hauler.

Each residential household should have received a 65-gallon recycling toter. If you did not receive your toter or require a second one, please contact the township office at 814-868-9686 Monday through Friday from 8:00 am–4:00 pm.

Properly sort your recyclable materials from your trash and ensure all items are loose in the toter; no bagged items are allowed. Allowable items include newspaper, full-size office paper, cardboard, paperboard boxes, plastic bottles, plastic jugs, plastic jars, aluminum drink cans, and metal food cans.

Recycling your old electronics is also mandatory, which you can do at our annual spring clean-up. This year's spring clean-up will be on Friday, May 9, and Saturday, May 10. You can also recycle your old electronics through the Erie County Recycling Program or at the store where you purchase your new product.



## CURBSIDE LEAF COLLECTION

Beginning in 2025, residents can opt to have their leaves picked up curbside. There will be a collection week in May and October. Residents must contact the township office at 814-868-9686 to register. All leaf waste must be placed in clear/transparent bags and placed at the curb during the scheduled leaf collection weeks. Clear bags may be obtained from any retailer of your choice. Bags must be placed separate from trash and recycling and CANNOT contain grass and/or branches. Consider mulching your leaves onto your lawn instead of bagging for a more eco-friendly alternative.



**GLASS RECYCLING IN SUMMIT**

Summit Township has partnered with Bayfront Glass, LLC to provide glass recycling to Summit Township residents. Bins are placed next to the Township Garage on Old French Road where the old Municipal Building used to be. Please follow the attached use instructions which are also posted on the bins.



## CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Summit Township follows SINGLE STREAM procedures which allow our residents to mix recyclables into one bin and place it at the curbside.



## Reporting Illicit Discharges

### What is an Illicit Discharge?



An illicit discharge is the disposing, dumping, spilling, emitting, or other discharge of any substance other than rain water into the storm sewer drainage system. The storm sewer drainage system includes streets, ditches, catch basins, yard drains, and stormwater detention/retention facilities.

Unlike sanitary sewers, storm sewer drains DO NOT lead to treatment facilities. This results in illicit discharges

causing water pollution by sending pollutants right into our swamps, streams, ponds, and lakes. Would you dump oil into Walnut Creek? If you dump oil into a drain at the end of your driveway then your answer would be yes. Be sure you know what illicit discharges are so you can help prevent water pollution and keep our water clean!


#### Examples of an illicit discharge include:

- Sanitary wastewater
- Effluent from septic tanks
- Car wash wastewaters
- Improper oil disposal
- Radiator flushing disposal
- Laundry wastewaters
- Improper disposal of auto and household toxics
- Sediment and pollutants from construction sites

- Any substance other than storm water discharged directly into the storm sewer drainage system is a violation of the Summit Township Stormwater Management Ordinance, the Pennsylvania Clean Stream Law and the Federal Clean Water Act. Violators could face possible fines and cleanup costs.






**PROTECT THE STORM SEWER SYSTEM:**

Ditches are part of the system used to convey storm water to a receiving lake, river or stream. Curbs and storm drain inlets are also part of the system. Many people don't realize that drain inlets and ditches are openings to the storm sewer. Anything that goes into this inlet - trash, leaves, hazardous materials - travels to Lake Erie.



# SUMMIT TOWNSHIP ANNUAL SPRING CLEAN-UP

Summit Township will hold their annual spring clean-up this year on Friday, May 9 and Saturday, May 10, 2025. The annual spring-clean up is a DROP-OFF PROGRAM provided to Summit Township Residents Only! Residents may bring in the eligible items to the Township Garage during the time period detailed below. Township crews will pick-up appliances containing Freon (i.e. refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers) for residents who have registered and paid for the Freon removal in advance.

## ALLOWABLE ITEMS FOR THIS YEAR'S COLLECTION:

- Air Conditioners (required freon removal fee paid)
- Appliances – Limited to **two** appliances per household.
  - Duplicates of same appliance not accepted (i.e. two dryers).
- Refrigerators/Freezers (doors removed and required Freon removal fee paid) Dehumidifiers (required Freon removal fee paid) Washers (clothes and dish), Dryers, Stoves, Hot Water Tanks
- Auto Parts (**NO GAS TANKS**)
  - Demolition Waste – bathtubs, sinks, toilets, house doors and windows **ONLY** (no other building demolition waste such as shingles, wood or blocks will be accepted)
- Electronics – TVs @nominal fee, computers, keyboards, monitors, etc.
- Furniture – TV's, mattresses, mattress springs, couch, chairs, dressers, tables
- Lawn Mowers/Roto-tillers/Snowblowers
- Metal Items (unlimited)
- Tires @ nominal fee – **LIMIT 12 TIRES PER HOUSEHOLD**
- Automotive Batteries

## ITEMS NOT ALLOWED – THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED:

- No Bagged Material – OF ANY KIND
- No Demolition Waste – other than items specifically listed above
- No Gasoline or Propane Tanks
- No Hazardous Waste – OF ANY KIND
- No Household Garbage
- No Paint or Oil Cans
- No Junk Vehicles
